## he Resurrection Story. What Easter is all about. HE IS RISEN! THE LORD IS RISEN INDEED!


For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son, so that all who believe in him should not perish but have everlasting life. John 3:16-This is what the resurrection story is all about, this is what Easter is all about. There are forty days leading up to Easter. During this period called Lent, we reflect on why Jesus died for us, why he paid the ultimate sacrifice for the atonement of our sins. We enter a period of fasting, penitence and forgiveness for the sins we have committed, that are grievous unto God, after all that he has done for us and seek his forgiveness. The resurrection story gives us a clearer picture of Jesus' victory over death and sin, but, until all of us come to appreciate all that he has done for us and accept him, as king of kings and lord of lords and commit our lives to serving him, we will continue on in sin and the evil way, denying ourselves the right to live sober, righteous and godly lives, lives filled with peace, joy, hope and love. When God sent his Son, his only Son to die on the cross to save us, he already knew the beginning and the end, he knew our stubborn, rebellious hearts, he knew that he would have to allow Jesus to die on the cross and raise him up three days later, so that we would believe in him. The death of Jesus on the cross makes us sad, but the joys of knowing that he is risen, that he is seated at the right hand of God, daily making intercessions for us, give us all the more reason to celebrate Easter. If during the forty days of Lent we could abstain from sin and the evil way, if we could retrain ourselves to walk in the way of Cross, then surely, we should be able to continue on the path that will lead to heaven, where Jesus is. If the sinner who hung on the cross next to Jesus was able to recognize that there was something good and right about Jesus and accepted him, why are we who claim to be Christians rejecting him? Let us use Resurrection Sunday to reconnect with God and accept him.




