You may have tried to convince yourself that you have nothing wholesome to share, nothing that could be beneficial to others, but, one never knows what they have to say until God puts the words in their mouth and commands them to speak. All of us have a ministry within us, and that ministry sometimes is awakened after a tragedy, or an illness, or a need, or when someone has wronged us; but, most times, our ministry is furthered after we got saved. We then have a Jeremiah experience, where the message is like fire, shut up in our bones, dying to come out. What is on the inside of you dying to come out? What has God done for you that you want to tell the whole world? My brothers and sisters in Christ, God did not save us for ourselves. God saved us, so that we could become ambassadors for Him, to spread His good news without shame or fear, to let someone else know how awesome He really is. Too many of us are lukewarm in our service to God, it's time to get on fire for God. Let us do all that we can to encourage and build one another up, just as we are already doing. Everything that we do should be aimed at not furthering our own causes but to bring God honor and glory and praise. So, whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him. Let the message about Christ, in all its richness, fill your lives. Teach and counsel each other with all the wisdom he gives. Sing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs to God with thankful hearts and others will come to know God through you, and you will be proud of your mess that turned into a message. Praise the Lord!

forgive you! This is most time easier said than done. Could I ask God to forgive me when I can't forgive others?

"And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us." Why do we daily ask this of God, and still find it so hard to forgive others? My brothers and sisters in Christ, forgiveness brings freedom - be kind, tenderhearted and forgiving, one to another, as God in Christ forgave you. Unlike traditional prisons, there is no guard who could open the door and set us free, we alone hold the key and humility is the trigger. Many are hard-pressed to forgive, because it may seem like they are weak, but I know from personal experience, that it takes a big person to say I am sorry, and an even stronger person to forgive. God has forgiven us so many times and most times for the same sin. Could we not forgive someone who has wronged us one time? "And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." Let us practice what we preach - forgiving others as we have been forgiven. Let us put aside our pride which prevents us from humbling ourselves, which is necessary in forgiving others. Scripture reminds us, that, "In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace," and if he so shows us mercy, it should not be so hard for us to also be merciful one to one another. Sometimes we too find it hard to forgive ourselves for the things that we have done, when God has already forgiven us. Let it go, so that you could be free. What has your sister or brother done to you that you cannot forgive? Why are you burdened with seeds of unforgiveness when you could be harvesting fruits of love. "Come, let us settle the matter says the Lord, though your sins are like scarlet they shall be white as snow, and though they are red like crimson, they shall be as wool." The Lord our God is merciful and forgiving, even though we have rebelled against him He has removed our sins from us, as far as the east is from the west. So, the next time you begin to say the Lord's Prayer, and you remember that you hold something against someone forgive them, so that your father in heaven could forgive you also. It's not fair to ask God to forgive us, when we are not able to forgive our brothers and sisters.

The best comfort for someone going through an affliction is to be encouraged by someone who has walked that same pathway.


