
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Prayer Changes Everything! I Believe in the Power of Prayer!

e still, and know that I am God! Many of us read this verse in Psalm Forty-six, but are we ever still, long enough, to see the goodness of our God?

For two consecutive mornings this month, and very early in the New Year, I opened my Bible to begin my reflection, and it brought me to Psalm Forty-six and verse ten, "Be still and know that I am God! I will be honored by every nation. I will be honored throughout the world." My brothers and sisters in Christ, I know who my God is, I know how to be still in his presence, but am I honoring him enough? I mulled over this, trying to understand what it could mean for me. Whenever I encounter a passage in the Bible that is as profound as this, I always try to determine, if the message is for me or for someone else. "Be still and know that I am God! I will be honored by every nation." The more I study this verse, the clearer it seems to me like God is giving me a direct message, "Be still and see what I will do!" I don't know what God has in store for me, but I am confident that his plans for me are for good. I am confident that his plans for me will bring him honor and great glory. In Psalm Forty-six, God is telling us to be still and know that he is God. Many of us find it hard to be still in God's presence. When we come before him, most times it's to complain, or to make our requests known to him. But how often do we sit quietly in his presence? I know that this is not an easy thing to do; because I could speak for myself when I say, that many times I am willing to be still in God's presence, and await his directions, but I lose focus, all kinds of things come to mind, things that leave me confused. So, I am trying my best to be still in God's presence and await his assignment, because whatever he has in mind for me this year, is not for vain glory, but to bring God glory and praise. Lord, you speak and we listen, you order our steps when we are willing, and I am asking you, begging you, to give me a willing heart, for if the willingness is there, the gift is acceptable. Lord, use me, to bring you honor and glory.




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am fearfully and wonderfully made. How about you?





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ur Spotlight is on you! Do not allow the thorn in your flesh, to cause you to miss out on God's blessings. Be strong in the Lord!

Who or what is the thorn in your flesh? All of us, will at some point experience a thorn in the flesh, but especially those of us who are of the faith, that thorn will and could be for us a good thing. We are weakened, then strengthened by it. But, where do these thorns come from, why are we targeted in such a way? Scripture reminds us in second Corinthians twelve, and verse seven, "I have received such wonderful revelations from God; so, to keep me from becoming proud, I was given a thorn in my flesh, a messenger from Satan to torment me, and keep me from becoming proud." Sometimes, we deserve the thorns in our flesh, we deserve to be knocked down a notch, because we get so high-minded, we so get full of self-praise; so to keep us from becoming conceited, we encounter thorns in the flesh. My brothers and sisters in Christ, we must be encouraged by the writings of the apostle Paul to the Corinthians, in that he said, "Therefore I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may rest upon me. For the sake of Christ, then, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities. For when I am weak, then I am strong", strong in the Lord! God resists the proud, therefore, in all things, let us be humble, let us submit ourselves to God, resisting the devil, so that that neither him, nor his messengers, will be able to buffet us.

hildren's Corner: Raising humble children in a pressured world. It takes a village.

How do we raise humble children in a pressured world? Our children are faced with peer-pressure every day, they know the right thing to do, but are pressured into doing what is wrong. So many of them lose their way and most importantly, their self— esteem. Today, so many children are suffering with depression, they have not yet begun to live, yet they are saying they have nothing to live for. Could we reverse this? Absolutely. Children, need a reason to believe, we need to raise more God-fearing children, we need to constantly show them love—genuine love. In my experience with mentoring teenagers especially, I have seen big changes in them, by just showing them that I care, and not by just paying them lip service, but getting involved in their daily lives. There is such a break down in our society, and single parents especially, need to embrace the village, to raise humble children in a pressured world. Without the extended family environment that we grew up in, single parents cannot do this alone. Extra eyes and ears are needed, and we must always remember, that, when our kids won't talk to us, they will confide in someone else. Our youths need to be heard, our youths need to be nurtured, our youths are depending on us more than we are there for them, and we need to change that. It takes a village.
